

Announcing the
Outstanding Service Award in Mathematics

Outstanding service is defined as one or more of the following:

1. Service to the department and university by completing several responsibilities, or one responsibility across more than one semester, directly related to the mathematics department (course assistant, research assistant, club officer, tutoring).
2. Service to the regional community by engaging in mathematics education projects or services that improve community resources (educational institutions, organizations, non-profit agencies) that extends beyond the requirements of a particular course.

To enter:

1. Must be a Mathematics or Mathematics Education majors with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and with a minimum 10 credit hours in mathematics courses taken at 300 level or above.
2. Submit a description of your service activities and an explanation of how knowledge gained from your mathematics degree is being applied in the service setting (not to exceed two pages).
3. Submit a letter of support from someone familiar with your service activities, such as a faculty member or supervisor.

You must submit the application to the Mathematics Department in NS-301B prior to noon on March 23.

A cash prize of \$100 will be awarded to the winner!
